> "Kodaly Methodology and Choral Techniques in the Philippine Setting" (Levels I - III)

April 18 - 29, 2016 (Mondays - Fridays) 8:00 am to 4:30 pm Fees: P 8,800 for assessment (credit), P 7,800 for audit,

US\$ 450 for foreign participants, P 3,500 for individual course *registration fee includes membership fee, tuition, materials, lunch.

This is a ten-day course in music education, particularly focusing on the internationally-known and highly effective Kodály Approach. Subjects include Musicianship, Methodology, Practicum, Materials, Conducting, Chair, Dalcroze, Recorder and Philippine and Asian Music.

Enrollees can take the course for a) assessment (credit) or b) non-assessment (audit).

- a) Assessment (credit): a grade will be given at the end of the course based on:
 - course work: Lesson plans, strategy papers, song analysis, dictation, etc.
 - performance: demo-teaching, conducting, play and .sing, etc.

After 3 or 4 summers of study, those who have met the requirements for graduation will receive the Certificate in Teaching Music with Kodály Emphasis.

b) Non-assessment (audit): regular seminar-workshop set-up with a Certificate of Attendance at the end

The Certificate Course is part of the graduate program of The Philippine Women's University. Thus, all subjects that have been

taken for credit during the summer can be enrolled during the regular school year after finishing the Certificate Course. Upon completion of minimum requirements these will be credited to the degree program MASTER OF ARTS IN MUSIC EDUCATION with emphasis in the Kodály Approach. The test will include sight reading and listening.

Daisy Marasigan and Roselle Elinore Matias of the Ateneo de Manila Grade School, Veralyn Monte of the Immaculate Conception Academy, Emmanuel De Leon of the UP Manila Chorale, Pauline Wong, Venitta Marie Victoria Magpantay of the Lipa Academy for Math and Science, and Catherine Cheng.

Judit Hartyányi retired from the Liszt Academy of Music in Budapest, Hungary in 2021 after teaching Choral Conducting and Music Education and being Director of the Women's Chorus. Since 1995, she has taught frequently in the Holy Names University Kodály academic year and summer institute pragrams in Oakland, U.S. She has served as juror for numerous international choral competitions, and has taught summer courses and workshops in Italy, Slovenia, Ireland, Malaysia, England and the USA. Her last visit to the Philippines was in 2012. Judit served as Vice President of the International Kodaly Society (IKS) from 2005: 2013.
