USec Ocampo and RD San Antonio visit GNHS-SHS

DepEd officials Undersecretary for Curriculum and Instruction Dr. Dina S. Ocampo and Regional Director Dr. Diosdado M. San Antonio visited the Grade 11 teachers and students of Gulang-Gulang National High School (GNHS) on the opening day of Senior High School (SHS) classes as they mark the history of changes in the Philippine education system on June 15.

USec Ocampo and RD San Antonio inspected the four SHS classrooms of GNHS offering Technical and Vocational Livelihood (TVL) track and Academic track including General Academics (GAS), Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM), and Accountancy, Business, and Management (ABM) strands.

Meanwhile, they interviewed the students on the importance of SHS and reasons of choosing their respective tracks and strands. RD San Antonio further asked Grade 11 students about the learning they have gained in the class so far. A student replied, "These lessons teach us that we are capable of making our nation better". This reply gained a "thumbs up" gesture

from the director.

Daily Lesson Logs suggested to be used include the topics "Who am I as a Senior HS learner?", "What skills do I need to succeed in SHS?", and "What do I want to learn about it?" The first three weeks in Grade 11 classes covering the period June 13-30 will focus on the said topics.

On the other hand, they also asked about

the previous profession of the SHS teachers. Of the eight SHS teachers at GNHS, three were from JHS, namely, Azenith A. Gallano, Adoracion B. Remo, and Jennifer M. Oblefias. The other five; Rogemor C. Castillo, Lainjel Mayor, Lotus D. Rolle, Jennylyn Marace, and Mari Rose Ladera, were from external departments such as DSWD and Med-technology. Usec. Ocampo and RD San Antonio checked as well the number of



enrollees per class.

Usec. Ocampo particularly asked about what to do with the residences close to the SHS building. The school principal responded that they will be relocated in the proper place near the school. He also emphasized the value of teamwork, "working for a common interest" as he talked about factors for a successful team or ACTED – Autonomy in decision making, Clarity of goals and responsibilities, Team-orientedness of members, Effectiveness of communication, and Diversity of skills of members.

"For school year 2016-2017," the Director cited that, "our targets, among others, are to successfully implement Grade 11 Senior High School Program; consistently push for sustaining gains in National Press Conferences,

Palaro, FLAME and TEA governance; passionately pursue key strategies to a quality basic education services; and relentlessly enliven the mantra that says a region where excellence is a culture and quality is a commitment."

Break-out sessions were held to talk over of concerns regarding region's achievements, as senior high school, curriculum implementation, or and learning areas development.

Bińan City schools go 'full blast' on 1st day of classes

Simultaneous with the Department of Education (DepEd) national opening of classes on June 13, the 36 public elementary and secondary schools in the Division of Binan City also had their full blast operations, catering to 49,787 initial enrolment on the first day.

Schools were all set and classes officially started with teachers who are on-task in the delivery of instruction. Students in uniform flocked to schools ready to learn new lessons.

"The first day of classes went on smooth sailing because all sectors played their roles in seeing to it that the opening will be all right," said Mr. Nicolas M. Burgos, Assistant Schools Division Superintendent.



Among the problems faced by students, teachers and administrators were classroom shortage due to failure to finish constructions of DepEd buildings as scheduled and late registration of transferees.

Issues on parents insisting that their children be accepted to Grade 1 having finished kindergarten at barangay day care centers and non-registered private schools were also addressed.



Mr. Burgos explained that the authorities in the division are just enforcing the rules to comply to DepEd regulations.

Meanwhile, senior high school implementers had a good head start despite inadequacy of facilities.

Regional representative, Mr. Danilo H. Ilagan, division officials headed by SDS Hereberto Jose D. Miranda, CESO VI in partnership with the city government led by Mayor-elect Walfredo R. Dimaguila, Jr. conducted rigid monitoring to ensure a responsive and efficient Oplan Balik Eskwela campaign.

Help desks and security groups were in place to accommodate concerns of parents, students and other stakeholders.

Calaca Central School commemorates 118th Philippine Independence Day

In this year's celebration of the 118th Independence Day, the Incumbent President of the Philippines, Benigno Simeon C. Aquino led the national commemoration through a simultaneous raising of the National Flag at 8:00 in the morning preceded by holiday honors by the AFP to the President followed by wreath-laying ceremony at the Rizal Monument in Rizal Park. Other government officials also led the flag-raising ceremony on different parts of the nation.

The annual June 12 observance of Philippine Independence Day came into effect after former President Diosdado Macapagal signed the Republic Act. No. 4166 on August 4, 1964. This Act legalized the holiday, which based on the Declaration of Independence on June 12, 1898 by General Emilio Aguinaldo and Filipino revolutionary forces from the Spanish colonization. Aguinaldo believed that a declaration of Independence would inspire the

people to fight back against the Spaniards and at the same time lead other nations to recognize the independence of the Philippines. This event took place at the Aguinaldo house in Kawit, Cavite where the Philippine flag was raised and its national anthem was played for the first time.

In commemoration of this historic day, the Calaca Central School celebrated the event with the ceremonial flag raising at around 7:30 in

the morning. Pupils, parents and officers from different nearby barangays were present. Mrs. Marites V. Tanio hosted the event. The program started with the opening remarks by Mrs. Nerissa Calingasan in which she highlighted the importance of the special

occasion. The National Anthem was conducted by Mrs. Dorotea Marasigan followed by the pledge to the Philippine flag. To formally close the event, Mrs. Asuncion A. Macalindong, the School Principal, delivered the closing remarks. She thanked the pupils, teachers, parents and barangay officials who attended the flag raising ceremony.
