Summit, Conference on K to 12 BEP bonds public, private schools

Bannering the theme "One DepEd for Quality Basic Education," selected school heads shared their best practices on the actual implementation of the K TO 12 basic education program among fellow school heads from the public and private sectors, March 24, at Hotel Dominique, Tagaytay City.

The summit cum conference provided a venue for public and private senior high school program implementers to collaborate and discuss resolutions on issues such as facilities, curriculum implementation, enrolment, teacher hiring and training, and establishment of partnerships with various stakeholders.

A five-minute presentation and a five-minute reaction comprised the discussion of each issue, followed by a small and big group discussion and an open forum with Schools Division Superintendent (SDS) Cherrylou de Mesa, to be able to come up with agreements and resolutions for topics at hand and other inquiries and concerns of the participants.

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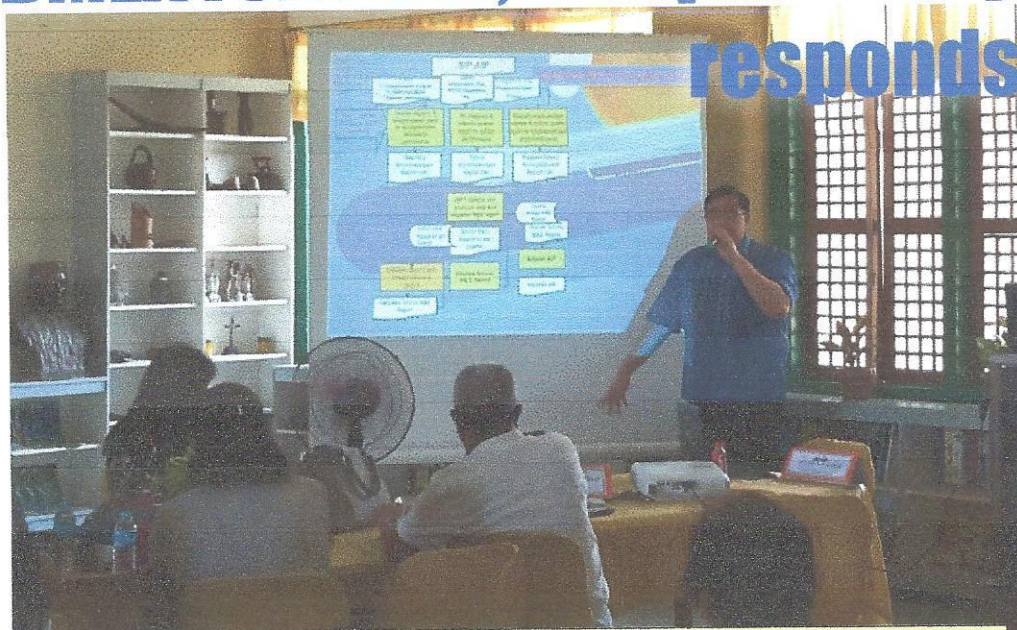

DMEA rolls out; SHs positively responds



FROM "FAULT-FINDER" TO "FRIENDLY." School heads show optimism in welcoming the new M & E systems and processes as SEPS Allain discusses the school MEA process flow.

The three-day rollout training on the Division Monitoring, Evaluation, and Adjustments (DMEA) initiated by Public Schools District Supervisors (PSDSs) in their respective cities and municipalities has been gaining deeper grounds and wider acceptance from the school stakeholders since it was started by the North Cluster (composed of the municipalities of Kawit, Noveleta, and Rosario) last March 14 at Aguinaldo Elementary School, Kawit, Cavite.

District Offices in each cities and municipalities under the Schools Division of Cavite intensified the rollout of DMEA to capacitate school heads in the use of monitoring and evaluation tools and technology; maximize its benefits to ensure quality service delivery of basic education curriculum and timely implementation of programs and projects through informed decisions, and; strengthen M & E systems in the organizational framework.

Dr. Diana P. Topacio, PSDS In-charge in M & E Unit of the Schools Governance and Operations Division (SGOD), together with Dr. Allain B. Alvarez, Senior Education Program Specialist, and Jonathan S. Jimenez, Education Program Specialist II, the division rollout was conducted on December 2-3, 2016 at Bulwagang Tanglaw

(formerly Division Library Hub) with the PSDSs as participants.

The DMEA rollouts in each of the 19 cities and municipalities are through the initiative of their respective PSDSs with the help of their school heads and the Division M & E Team.

Cities and municipalities that hosted the rollouts include Silang (Lalaan Elementary School, March 14-16) composed of Silang, GMA, and Carmona;

Indang (Indang Central Elementary School, March 14-16) including Amadeo; Maragondon (Cavite Science National High School, March 15-17) composed of Naic, Maragondon, and Ternate; Trece Martires City (Trece Martires City Elementary School, March 15-17) including Gen. 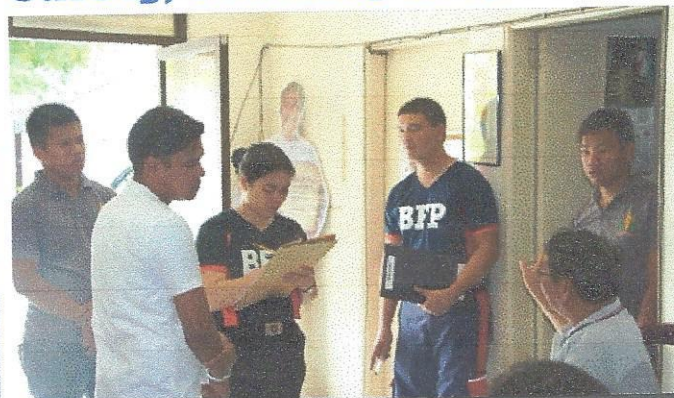

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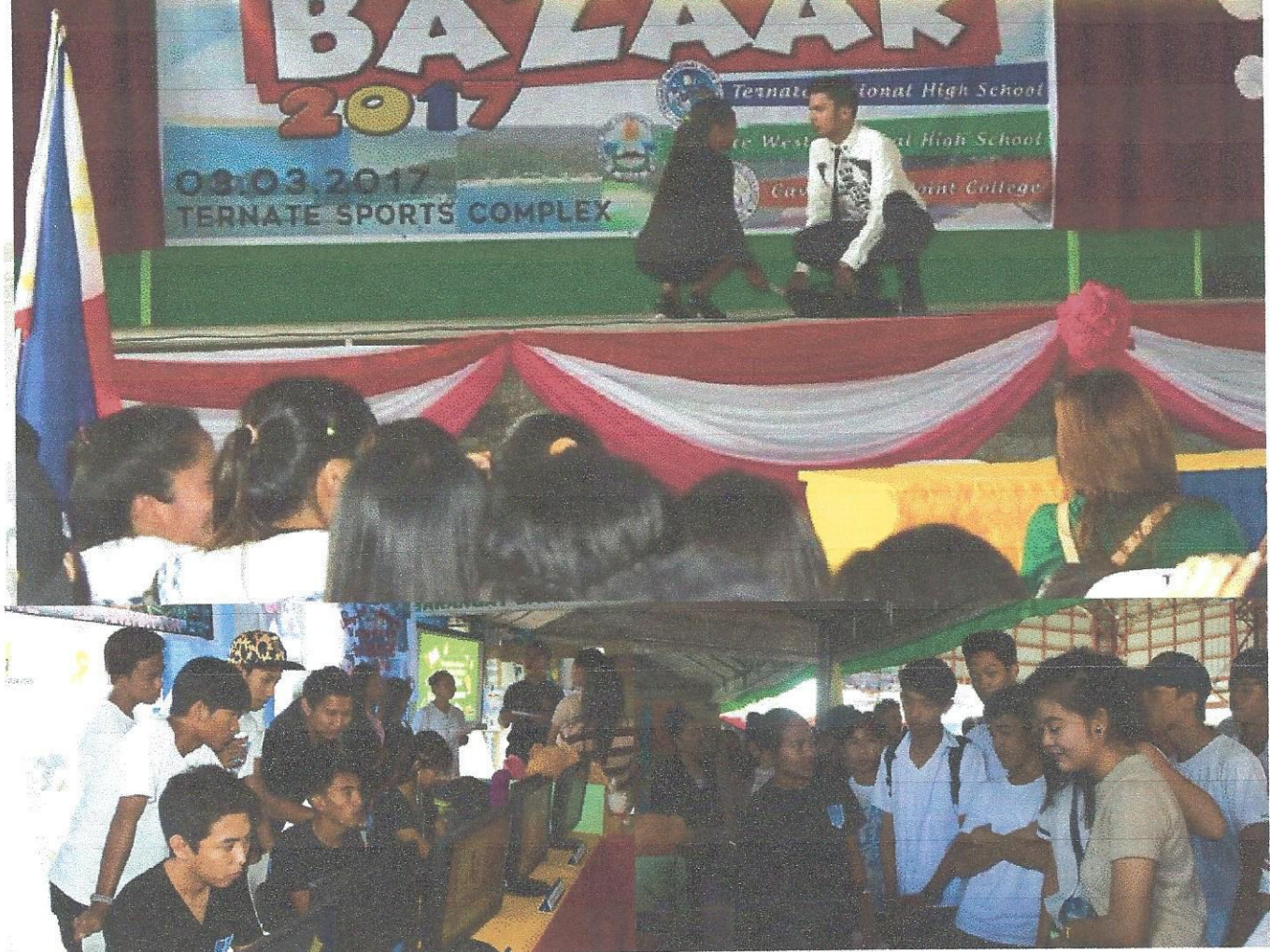
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Public, private schools gather for 2nd SHS Bazaar

The newly-elected officers, who took their oath on March 6, are to undergo parallel school-based trainings to

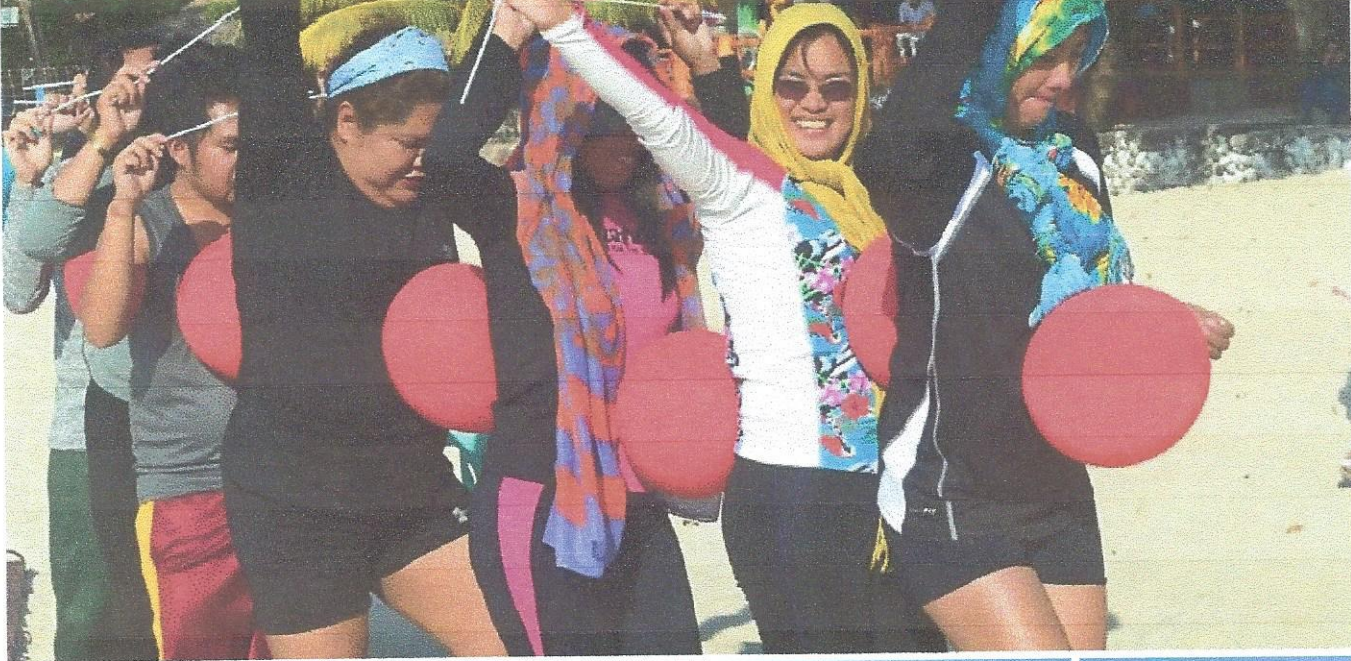
enhance their leadership skills and readress their roles, functions, and responsibilities to the student body.
