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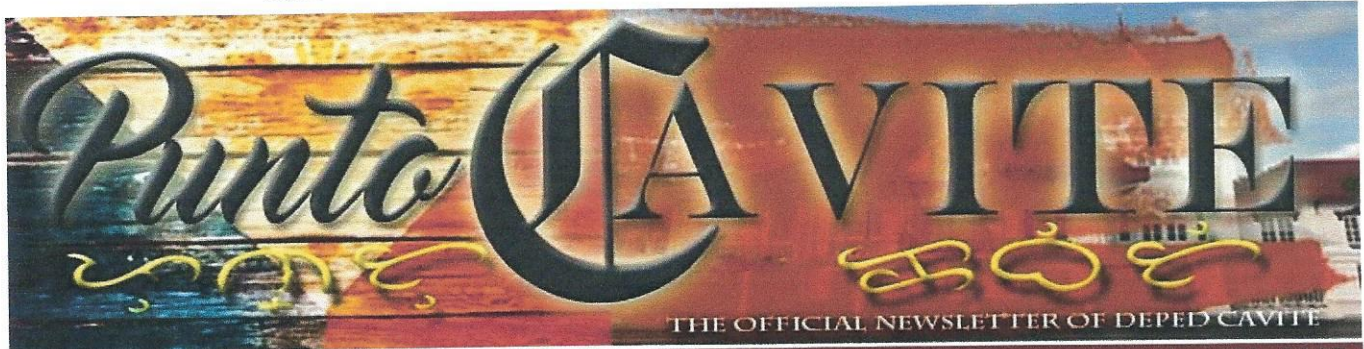

**D**epEd Cavite empowered 1,143 Grade 6 teachers through the Phase 2 of the mass training of Grade 6 teachers on the implementation of K-12 Basic Education Curriculum at Tanza Oasis Hotel and Resort, Capipisa Tanza Cavite last July 4-6 and 10-12, 2017.

The second phase of the said training aimed at enabling the Grade 6 teachers of Cavite to demonstrate an in-depth

understanding of the content per learning area; identify appropriate techniques and strategies for specific learning content; and contextualize learning contents.

According to Gina B. Dulce, OIC Senior Education Program Specialist of the HRTD, this training focused more on content of the different learning areas as well as the strategies to be used by the teachers in the field.

Aiming to achieve the Education for All (EFA) and Magna Carta for Persons with Disabilities (Republic Act 7277) targets and strengthen the implementation of authentic inclusive education program, the three-Saturday training-workshop sought to provide quality basic education that is equitably accessible to all through the implementation of authentic inclusive education that welcomes diversity barriers for lifelong learning and to lay the foundation for barrier-free environment through the provision of conducive, child-friendly, and appropriate facilities for all types of learners.

Moreover, it aspired to promote universal participation by enhancing educational opportunity for all learners by securing they have equal access to appropriate and relevant equipment, facilities, and learning resources and information. The workshop is also directed to the building of an inclusive culture and implementation of inclusive policies and evolving practices.

More than 400 school heads, Special Education (SPED) teachers, receiving teachers, and guidance counsellors from selected secondary and elementary schools and Alternative Learning System attended the event which was graced by Dr. Manuela Tolentino, Schools Division Superintendent of Dasmariñas, and Dr. Maribeth de Dios, Public Schools District Supervisor (PSDS) of Rizal, who expounded the index for inclusion to develop Inclusive School and the transition of Special Education Model to Inclusive Education Model, respectively, during the first day, June 10. Pasiolan reviewed the legal bases of Special Education in the Philippines.

Ms. Flormelinda Reyes shared her expertise in developing tools and resources to support inclusive education along with Dr. Imelda Quiñonez who discussed the theory and practice of the universal design for learning, June 17. The participants were grouped into six for their breakout sessions where they created special learner-appropriate instructional materials through the guidance of Ms. Regina Marasigan. Furthermore, Ms. Annie Maraon discussed classroom management strategies for inclusion classroom, June 24.

Under the inclusion model, the use of special schools or classrooms to separate students with mild to moderate special needs from regular students is rejected. To date, SPED Centers within the Division of Cavite Province, particularly Tagaytay and GMA SPED Centers, had underwent classroom restructuring wherein a teacher coach/ shadow teacher will assist the receiving teacher in the preparation and implementation of curriculum/ instructional plan so that all students learn together.
