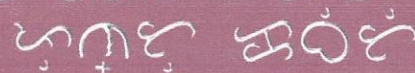

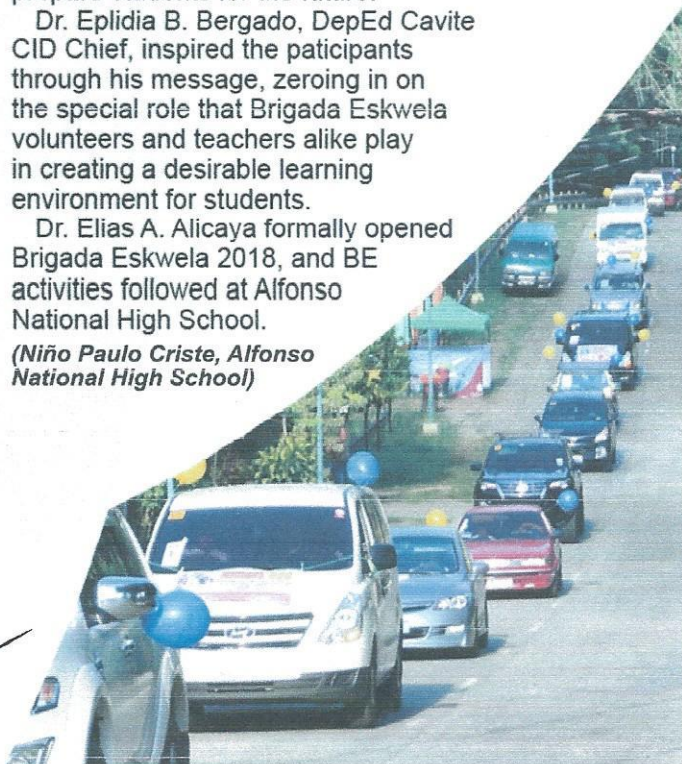

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RO preps up DepEd Cavite for surveillance audit

DepEd Region IV-A CALABARZON, through Engr. Edenia O. Libranda, chief of the Quality Assurance Division, prepped up DepEd Cavite for its upcoming surveillance audit on August 3, 2018.

Libranda shared the preparations undergone by the Regional Office to fill in the gaps that resulted from AJA Registrars' ISO 9001:2015 certifying audit last year and to pass the surveillance audit recently.

She underscored that DepEd Cavite should ensure that the opportunities for improvement (OFIs) identified by AJA during the certifying audit must be addressed prior to the

surveillance. She advised having a stricter monitoring of the compliance of all units and sections to the standard implementation of their respective procedures.

She also discussed minor details which may be overlooked in the implementation of the quality management system (QMS) procedures but could affect the whole turnout of the upcoming audit.

Libranda identified three pointers which the auditors would be looking for when they review DepEd Cavite's QMS: (1) conformity to the requirements of the ISO 9001 standards which would be assessed through reviewing the adequacy of documentation; (2) conformity to the written procedures, and; (3) active review and improvement of the QMS as a result of internal audits, management review, and the review of procedures and plans and the objectives the Division are setting.

The surveillance audit ensures that an organization or institution's continued compliance with the ISO standard and the policies and processes. Auditors look for evidence that the quality management system is being maintained in its entirety and improved and corrected as needed.

The outcome of the surveillance audit would determine if DepEd Cavite could continue to hold ISO 9001:2015 certification.

DepEd Cavite received its certificate last September with zero major and minor non-compliance and seven OFIs. The Office targets to sustain if not improve this in undergoing the surveillance audit. [P]

HBNHS produces 100% VGD NC III passers

Eight out of 8 students (100%) from Halang Banaybanay National High School (HBNHS) passed the Visual Graphic Design National Certification III (VGD NCIII) assessment last May 21, 2018 at DATACOM-Imus, Palico II, Imus City.

The new VGD NC III holders were grade 10 students Mikhail Joshua I. Tanawan, Leane Jasha I. Tanawan,

Maylene M. Javier, Mary Mae T. Francisco, Ashlee Nicole L. Pacifico, Romeo V. Villanueva, Jr., Allen E. Angcanan, and Jewel B. Mojica.

HBNHS' grades 9 and 10 students were trained by Mrs. Cecilia A. Caraan on their Technology & Livelihood Education (TLE) subject utilizing specialized course. Ms. Norielyn C. Narciso, then HBNHS principal, and Ms. Caraan

encouraged them to take the assessment and certification to determine whether students can perform the principles expected in the workplace based on the required competency standards set by TESDA. After the assessment, students may find their side line jobs in line with visual graphic design.

The Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), in cooperation with Department of Education (DepEd), arranged that the assessment and certification of students will now be part of the K to 12 curriculum to boost the students' chances of employment after graduation.

Former Secretary General Joel Villanueva once said, "NC I & NC II TESDA qualifications will be mainstreamed in the specialization phase which falls during Grade 9-12. Thus, it becomes imperative for TESDA to move up and focus towards the development and implementation of higher level qualifications." (Cecilia A. Caraan, Halang Banaybanay National High School)

356 SHS graduates from public and private schools

tried their luck with the 12 companies from the manufacturing, production, retailing, merchandising, business process outsourcing, and information technology-enabled industries which offered a total of 3,659 job opportunities.

Based on initial reports, 12 applicants were directly hired on the spot while 212 others would still undergo further

assessment.

DepEd Cavite improved its Principal's Test passing rate from 5 (2.66 %) out of 188 passers in 2016 to 39 (19.40%) out of 201 qualifiers for 2017.

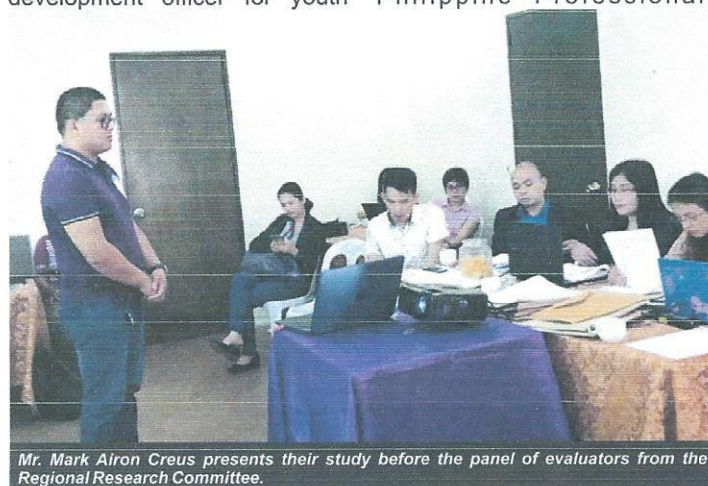

Public elementary and secondary schools from nineteen municipalities in gathered at Rodeo Hills at 6:00 in the morning to start the caravan.

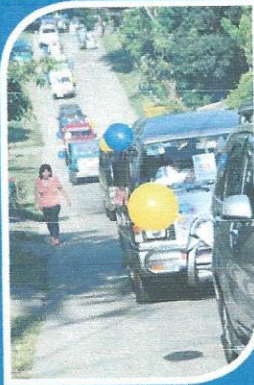
