"Collab: Imagined Spaces and Multiple Voices"

In commemoration of its 30<sup>th</sup> founding anniversary, ARTIST launched an international arts exchange and collaborative event. Dubbed LIKHANDULA, the event gathered artists, cultural workers, artist-teachers, performing ensembles, arts managers, cultural organizers and community of creative to render contemporary art genres and exchange practices.

LIKHANDULA is a derivative of two words, namely: "likha" which means 'to create' and "dula" roughly translated refer to "stage performance". The training manual of ARTIST Inc. on theatre improvisation is also coined LIKHANDULA. It has been used by various schools and organizations, in the country and abroad, as instructional materials to develop and mount performances. Now, it is also the title of our event on international arts exchange and collaboration

On its first year in 2017, fifty (50) performances were rendered by different groups and individuals from the different regions of the Philippines with special participation of international guests from Taiwan and Australia. The second year of the event in 2018 featured the collaboration of different performing groups which showcased the play written and directed by Catherine Diamond of Taiwan among the home-grown talents of ARTIST Inc. and workshops which provided venue for collaboration of new performances.

This 2019, ARTIST Inc. will once again hold the LIKHANDULA International Arts Exchange and Collaboration on February 26 - March 3, at the University of the Philippines Los Baños. The theme of this year's event is COLLAB: IMAGINED SPACES AND MULTIPLE VOICES. With the said theme, the event serves as a platform for conversation of arts and culture practices among artists, teacher-artists, cultural workers and community of creative through joint performances, exhibits, workshops and forum to able to share perceived picture or imagery of reality in varied and emerging perspectives to include the practice of the marginalized, at the edge and of resistance.

## PROJECT COMPONENTS

The 3<sup>rd</sup> LIKHANDULA has four components, namely: workshops, performances, exhibits and forum.

### A. WORKSHOPS

- TAGPOGRAPIYA. Workshop on lights designing that will introduce the participants into the fundamentals of illuminating an exhibit, a performance or any creative event.
- SINING GANAP. Workshop on devised theatre that will engage the participants in collective theatre-making processes.
- TANGHAL SINING. Workshop on performance art that will provide venue to appreciate the performer's body, time and space in defining the relationship between performer and audience.

4. SINING KONTEMPORARYO. Participants will be introduced and challenged to explore collectively the basic features and production of hip hop dancing, classical guitar-playing and tattoo designing.

### C. FORUM

Dubbed The Artist Praxis (TAPx), this component will provide an avenue for dialogue among participating individuals and organizations regarding their praxis on various subthemes:

- Pattern 1. Creative Avenues: Arts in the Classroom and Beyond for Lifelong Learning.

  Discussions on usage and importance of the arts in the enriched learning of students in and out of the classroom.
- Pattern 2. Ripples to Rolls: Arts for Advocacy
  Discussions on using the arts to advance advocacies and its role in social transformation.
- Pattern 3. Breadbasket: Arts to Sustain Life
  Discussions on looking at the arts as a career choice a means of living and some practices on sustaining lives through the arts.
- Pattern 4. Millstones and Milestones: Creative Processes and Systems
  Discussions on the processes that artists take on when creating their works, and the relationship of these processes with the systems that work in an arts organization.
